## **A. Code of Conduct - Juvenile Player and Parents/Guardians:**

### **Juvenile Players**

- Membership is due on 1<sup>st</sup> January of each year and is required to be paid within 31 days of that date
- Players must remember they are representing Carrigtwohill Juvenile GAA, their families, themselves and the wider Carrigtwohill Community.
- Players must always wear club colours on the field of play
- Players are required to give priority to their own age group and also to club GAA as opposed to non-club GAA
- Players are required to attend training sessions and matches on time and with the proper equipment.
- Players should play and train with commitment and in a competitive but fair manner
- Players are to be respectful at all times to referees and officials and accept their decisions
- Players are to be respectful at all times to all players of both teams, coaches, mentors, parents, fans and attendees at all club related activities
- Players are not allowed to use foul or abusive language
- Bullying is totally unacceptable
- Players are to always remember GAA is a team game and encourage fellow players
- Players should always respect the club and its property and every other clubs properties for away matches.
- Players must never leave their position on the field to get involved in an incident elsewhere on the field
- Players should always shake hands with opponent after game. Win with humility - loose with dignity
- Players are not permitted to Smoke or drink alcohol while training with or representing Carrigtwohill Juvenile GAA Club.

### **Parents & Guardians**

- Be familiar with those mentors who are coaching your child
- Behave responsibly on the sideline
- Encourage your child to play by the rules and abide by the code of conduct
- Ensure your child has the proper training/playing gear
- Inform the club / team mentors of any medical condition or special needs of their child
- Always remember you are a member of Carrigtwohill GAA & are representing the club and the wider Carrigtwohill community at club matches and club related activities you attend
- Do not use foul or offensive language at matches - children are present
- Parents should provide positive, encouraging support to all Carrigtwohill Juvenile teams
- Parents should behave responsibly & refrain from negative comments & criticism of participants at matches
- Parents should bring children to and from training and matches on time
- Parents should support & encourage your child to practice the skills of GAA at home in their spare time
- Parents should support the mentors and help out whenever necessary
- Parents should ensure child is registered and a paid-up member of Carrigtwohill Juvenile GAA Club
- Parents should respect the mentor's decision & encourage your child to do the same
- Parents should show your support of your child/team by attending matches on a regular basis where possible
- Parents should not under any circumstances enter the field of play while a match is in progress
- Parents must not criticise referees and officials publicly. This never achieves anything positive & may have the opposite effect
- Parents must respect the opposition & never get in an altercation with any member of the opposition

## **B. Other Considerations:**

### **Assumptions with Membership**

1. It is club policy to assume permission has been granted by parents to players to be available for training and matches in the age group immediately above their own, i.e. an under 9 player may participate in Under 10 activities and an under 13 player may participate in Under 14 activities. This is normally as a result of restrictions due to numbers available to some squads but is always found to be of great benefit to all players who participate in this manner.
2. Carrigtwohill Juvenile GAA Club will publish pictures and reports/reviews to our Club web page, Twitter, Facebook and Youtube. It may also seek to submit material of this nature to local and non-local journals and newspapers. This is intended to promote the Club's and players' efforts and achievements to a wider community and also promote team and player achievements within the club itself. With regards to young players (Under 12 down) the policy is to not mention names on photos but may refer by name to players within a review or report. Older players may be referred to only if the photos or reports refer specifically to a player's own achievements such as gaining a place on a Cork County Development Squad or county team.

### **Parents - Please note the following in relation to the Club Grounds and Pitches**

Dogs (including puppies) are not permitted in the grounds whether they are on a lead or not. Please understand that we are responsible for all children who attend to play our games and some children are and will be afraid of them irrespective of the size, age or disposition of the dog. All children are entitled to attend at the club in Carrigtwohill without fear.

Also, dog fouling has become an issue on the grounds and pitches in the last couple of years. This has caused hygiene problems at training sessions and matches in the past and reflects badly on the club. It also has the potential to cause a serious injury to players.
